What's New Blueprint v6.2

This document describes the enhancements and new features introduced in Blueprint v6.2.

New Features

Global Search

Blueprint v6.2 introduces an enhancement to the search functionality called Global Search. With Global Search you can now perform searches in your current project, or across multiple open projects¹, querying all textual properties in Artifacts & Sub-Artifacts³. Search for a single piece of text, a text string, or a combination of both using a wildcard (*) to increase your search results.

Figure 1: This image is a sample of a search query using the term 'passenger'. You can see results are pulled from different Artifact Types, and the location is displayed in the Artifact Path column.

The Advanced Search functionality follows similar rules, with the addition of the ability to search any user property (excluding groups and imported users) across multiple projects². Advanced Search also drills down into the Name, Label, and Description fields when searching through sub-artifacts³ to display even more results. For example: Stakeholders have requested that the "CSR" position title be modified from "Customer Service Representative" to "Customer Support Representative". You complete an Advanced Search query to retrieve all Artifacts that contain the Name "CSR".

Open Recent Projects

Blueprint v6.2 now supports an Open Recent Projects function. From the File menu, selecting the **Open Recent** option will display a list of the last 10 recently accessed projects, with the last project opened at the top. This is especially useful when you need to quickly reference recent projects.

Accelerators

In the previous release (Blueprint 6.1) we introduced a new concept called 'Accelerators'. Accelerators automatically configure Blueprint to suit particular standards, processes, or software development approaches. Accelerators are downloadable packages available in the Blueprint Customer Portal that contain a Guide, along with components used to configure Blueprint with standard artifact types, standard properties, custom artifact types, custom properties, artifact type-property mappings, project folder structures, predefined artifacts, and other content.

The components inside an Accelerator can be Blueprint Projects, Excel or Visio files, or Blueprint "Packs".




Figure 3: This diagram outlines how an Accelerator can introduce pre-defined, standard Artifact types at the Instance or Project level.

Key Enhancements

This section lists the key enhancements to existing features and functionality that are found in Blueprint v6.2

Nonfunctional Requirements Accelerator

Complete with hundreds of questions organized by category, and sub category, along with a sample project, the Nonfunctional Requirements Accelerator provides a framework for you to gather requirements from various stakeholders. Blueprint's Nonfunctional Requirements Accelerator is based on industry-leading work by Roxanne Miller as described in her text "The Quest for Better Requirements". Recommended questions across fourteen categories spanning Operations, Revisions, and Transition of Business Applications will help you to elicit requirements easier and faster, instituting a consistent, repeatable process for nonfunctional requirements.

The sample project includes pre-configured nonfunctional requirement types and properties, which will jump start your projects.

Furthermore, you can then complete a RACI matrix right in Blueprint using the new Stakeholder artifacts. By completing the RACI Matrix in Blueprint, you can collect answers to your elicitation questions, tying each stakeholder's responses back to project requirements, increasing traceability.

Updated Password Requirements

In an effort to increase user security, Blueprint password requirements have been updated to enforce a stronger password policy. The new password requirements, which will be enforced for all new users (or password resets/changes), are listed below:

- Minimum length: 8 characters, maximum 128 characters
- Must contain at least:
 - ° One non-alphanumeric character
 - ° One numeric character
 - ° One capital letter
- Cannot match User Name or Display Name
